#### FELLOWSHIP in RECONSTRUCTIVE UROLOGY

Mr Evangelos Zacharakis was employed as a Fellow/Senior Registrar in Reconstructive Urology at the Academic Department of Urology, University College Hospital of London, UCLH NHS Trust, from 24th of April 2009 to 1st of Oct 2011.

This appointment is subject to the Terms and Conditions of Service of Hospital Medical and Dental Staff of England and Wales and General Medical Council conditions of service and it is pensionable in accordance with the NHS Pension regulations 1995.

The post is whole time and attracts a salary that is in accordance with the current NHS scale. It also involves on-call commitment for Urology at a Registrar level in a 1:10 rota. The above-mentioned post is recognised by the Royal College of Surgeons of England and is compliant with the Directive 93/16 of the EEC for sub-specialist training in General Surgery.

The post had significant clinical commitment both in emergency and elective surgical work. In addition this post allowed Mr Zacharakis the opportunity to establish significant academic research work. During the term of the Fellowship, Mr Zacharakis ran the delivery of the clinical service as a Senior Registrar/Fellow in the Department and coordinated care on the ward in conjunction with the junior staff and Consultants in the department. During this time Mr Zacharakis specialized in Reconstructive Urology.

Mr Zacharakis received training and gained significant experience, while in post, in many advanced and intermediate procedures including: Hypospadias repair, Anterior and posterior urethroplasties with or without use of graft, perineeal urethrostomies, urethral diverticulae repair, vesicourethral anastomoses, urorectal fistulae repair, Urethrocutaneous fistulae repair, insertion of artificial urinary sphincters, uerthral dilation, Bladder neck incisions, He has also participated and trained in advanced urological reconstructive procedures for the management of complex urological ceses, such as enterovesico fistula repair, revision and formation of ileal conduit, revision and formation of neobladder, reimplantation of ureters with Boari flap, revision and formation of Mitrifanoff channel, revision and formation of neoureters. During this period Mr Zacharakis became an independent operator in the hospital, performing regular operating lists without needing supervision.

In addition to the operative workload, during this time Mr Zacharakis was involved in the delivery of service in two Reconstructive Urology out-patients clinics per week, each with up to 30 patients attending.

He also participated as a Senior Registrar in Urology for the point of view of urological emergencies where he ran the emergency urology cover in a 1:10 rota and performed a wide variety of urgent surgical procedures independently.

As a Senior Registrar he had also been responsible for the supervision of senior and preregistration house officers, and liaising effectively with other medical, paramedical and managerial staff at various levels in order to maintain the smooth running of the firm. He has undertaken various routine and more specialized administrative tasks as discharge summaries, junior staff rota, operating session planning, waiting list management and initiatives, implementing and running of clinical audit systems.

Mr Zacharakis during this period demonstrated excellent clinical judgement and surgical skills in the management of patients and communicated excellently with patients, their relatives and staff. He gave an excellent service during his period as Senior Registrar and was respected by all his colleagues.
